Dr. Teofilo Ozuna is an Associate Professor in the Department of Economics and Finance and Dean of the College of Business Administration at The University of Texas Pan American. He received his PhD from Texas A & M University in College Station, Texas in 1989. Before coming to UTPA in September 2000, he was on the faculty at Texas A & M University from 1988 to 2000.

He has also been a visiting professor at the Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey (ITESM) in Monterrey, México; Universidad de las Americas in Puebla, Mexico; Universidad Autónoma de Nuevo León in Monterrey, México; Universidad de Salamanca in Salamanca, Spain; Universidad del Valle de Guatemala in Guatemala, Guatemala; and Universidad Centro Americana in Managua, Nicaragua.

He has received 10 awards for teaching excellence and in 2004 and 2005 was recognized as a Who's Who Among Teachers. Dr. Ozuna is an accomplished scholar. He is a Border Fulbright Scholar and a Fulbright Specialist. He has published extensively in top economic and finance journals on topics such as natural resource valuation, economic development, international banking, and international finance and has made numerous professional and academic presentations at the international, national, regional, and local level.

He has undertaken consulting research projects for the World Bank, Inter-American Development Bank, U. S. Department of Commerce, U. S. Department of Justice, Mexico's National Water Commission, U. S. Agency for International Development, Texas A & M Energy Program, and various Texas cities and regional institutions.
